ASK NOT offers a rare and compelling exploration of the effects of the US Military's "Don't Ask Don't Tell" policy. A provocative portrait of bravery amidst exclusion, ASK NOT reveals the personal stories of Americans willing to risk their lives for a country that criminalizes the act of coming out. Current and veteran gay soldiers reveal how "Don't Ask Don't Tell" affects them during their tours of duty, as they struggle to maintain a double life, uncertain of whom they can trust.

This timely, award-winning film also explores how gay veterans and youth organizers are working to overturn the policy. How can the United States military claim to represent democracy and freedom while denying one segment of the population the right to serve? This exceptionally layered, intelligent and sensitive drama stars not one, but two openly gay actors: Chad Allen & Robert Gant. Allen plays a self-destructive addict hooked to anonymous sex and drugs who finally hits bottom.

Concerned for his welfare, his brother checks him into

Genesis House, an ex-gay Christian ministry overseen by a compassionate husband and wife team, Judith Light and Stephen Lang. Initially rebellious and suspicious of the ministry's work, Allen's character develops a close bond with a resident and "level 5" mentor (Gant) charged with guiding him through the steps. As Allen & Gant's affinity for each other strengthens, Light's character is forced to confront the values that she holds true, and finally face some truths about love. (USA, 2007, 93 min)

16 year-old Gertrude aka Tru is a typical high school teenager from an atypical home - she is raised by her two moms, who have just moved to a new town in suburban southern California, while her two dads remain in San Francisco. At school, Tru catches the eye of Lo, the closeted star quarterback who soon makes a deal with Tru to pretend they are an item. It's seems like a perfect solution – it keeps Lo's friends and family from asking too many questions, and it allows Tru to instantly find a place to belong in her new school. But when Tru befriends picked-upon openly gay student Walter and decides to join him in forming a Gay-Straight Alliance, she falls for GSA member Trevor, a handsome metrosexual who has been raised by his gay uncle.

Her new love affair threatens to expose Lo's true desires and standing as big man on campus. Funny, fresh, and endearing, and featuring breakout performances from its young cast, plus appearances by Alexandra Paul, Jasmine Guy, Bruce Vilanch, Marcia Wallace, Dave Kopay and many others. Dark and sexy real estate agent Victor is making a killing – literally! In an attempt to transform Madrid's Chueca neighborhood into the next Chelsea, he's come up with the perfect plan – murdering elderly women, making it look like suicide, buying up their property, and selling to

But when his latest victim leaves her apartment to Rey and Leo, the friendly working-class bear couple next door, Victor must hatch a scheme to get his way... no matter what. A JIHAD FOR LOVE Sunday, June 29 4:45pm

Filmed in 12 countries and spanning 9 languages, A JIHAD FOR LOVE is the world's first feature documentary to explore the complex global intersections between Islam and homosexuality. In Arabic jihad means 'struggle', and in this groundbreaking documentary, you witness first-hand how gay and lesbian Muslims attempt to live their lives as devoted Islamic believers in a world in which they are unwelcome. Go inside the lives of gay men and women at various crossroads. Some living openly. Many others are not so fortunate. Producer Sandi DuBowski (the Jewish director/producer of TREMBLING BEFORE G-D) and Director Parvez Sharma, (a gay Muslim himself) treat Islam and those interviewed with reverence and delicacy. THE EDGE OF HEAVEN

Gifted German-Turkish director Fatih Akin (HEAD-ON) returns with a border-hopping, genderbopping, culture-clashing drama of sneaky power and uncommon grace. Interweaving six characters and three

stories, Akin ably depicts the fluidity of 21st century European political and sexual identity. Winner of the Best Screenplay award at Cannes last year, Akin effortlessly transforms coincidences and contrivances into a profound tale of redemption and reconciliation. Hamburg professor Nejat is at first suspicious of his elderly father's unlikely paramour, a middle-aged Turkish prostitute named Yeter. But he and Yeter form a bond, and after tragedy strikes he treks to Istanbul to locate her daughter. It turns out that Ayten is a political activist who's had to flee to Germany. Stranded and broke, she's befriended by Lotte, a college student who lives with her mother (Fassbinder favorite Hana Schygulla). Ayten and Lotte become lovers, their complicated relationship fraught with secrets. When Ayten returns to Turkey, the smitten Lotte defies her mother and follows. A stranger in a strange land, willing to do anything for her gal, Lotte makes a grievous mistake. Eventually the threads are untangled, the missed connections get patched through and a new circle — and a new family — is created. Rated A- by Entertainment Weekly, THE EDGE OF HEAVEN is stunningly acted and beautifully photographed. (Germany, 2007, 122 min) In German with English subtitles.

WRANGLER: ANATOMY OF AN ICON

There have been dozens of gay porn stars, but only one Jack Wrangler. Bursting onto the scene in the early '70s, he wasn't the typical obscure object of desire but a full-bodied, self-confident stud.

Buff, masculine and clearly comfortable in his own skin, Wrangler was more than just a hot guy to fantasize about — he was a role model. With a screen persona that blended virility with a sly eye for fun, Wrangler was the first out actor to show how a gay man could be strong, secure and lustful. In this entertaining new film, Wrangler describes his journey from skinny Beverly Hills brat to aspiring actor to a brand name with a product line. Fans like Chi Chi La Rue and Bruce Vilanch drop by to sing Jack's praises. Rounding out the package are a wealth of clips of Wrangler strutting his stuff in vintage films. Proving that there are second —and third—acts in American life, Wrangler successfully made the jump to straight porn and, in recent years, established himself as a serious director of legit theater. The most surprising turn in Wrangler's iconoclastic life? Meeting and wooing songbird Margaret Whiting. Creative and vital, and as unconcerned as ever with the limits others would place on him, Jack Wrangler is still a role model. CHRIS & DON: A LOVE STORY

When 18-year-old Don Bachardy was introduced to 49-year-old Christopher Isherwood in 1950s Malibu, neither man knew it would be the start of a love story that would last for 30 years. CHRIS & DON chronicles their years together, with the vibrant and engaging Don at this extraordinary documentary's epicenter. Don, a UCLA student with artistic talents, became the ideal companion for Isherwood, the celebrated British writer best known for his Berlin Stories. Despite their age difference, a relationship blossomed, and Don soon moved in with Chris. Growing up in the LA suburbs enamored with Hollywood, Don had crashed premieres to take photos with celebrities. With Chris, he suddenly found himself hobnobbing with all manner of luminaries from the arts and literary scene, such as WH

Auden, Igor Stravinsky, and Tennessee Williams. Open about their relationship at a time when homosexuality wasn't discussed in polite conversation, Chris and Don weathered the various storms resulting from their different ages, classes, and backgrounds, and remained together until Chris' death in 1986. Combining interviews with Don, Chris' personal journal entries, rare home movies, and archival footage, the filmmakers have crafted a very personal story, best demonstrated through the charming animated sequences depicting the horse and cat alter-egos the couple doodled on their personal letters over the years. CHRIS & DON is a touching, illuminating portrait of the enduring power of love. (USA, 2007, 90 min)

WERE THE WORLD MINE

The most joyous gay film of the year, WERE THE WORLD MINE, is the perfect closer to our 2008 Festival! As the gay outcast at an all-boys prep school, Timothy (Tanner Cohen) is prone to daydreaming about the handsome jock. But his are no ordinary flights of fancy; they're musical theater extravaganzas, complete with show-stopping



songs, dazzling sets, and pirouetting rugby player chorus boys. So when the drama teacher invites Timothy to audition for *A Midsummers' Night Dream*, we know

that theater is his destiny. With a voice like honey, he's cast as the mischievous Puck, and - in a delicious surprise - shares the stage with Jonathon, the aforementioned handsome jock (Nathaniel David Becker). But the rabidly anti-gay coach wants to shut down the production: some of the school's finest athletes have been cast in female roles, and what could be more hetero-threatening than that?!

Aside from Timothy's "heteroflexible" but dyke-a-licious girl-pal Frankie (Robin William's daughter, Zelda), this small town is teeming with homophobes. Without giving too much away, let's just say that lovestruck Timothy really gets into character and turns all that upside down. The mastermind behind this bedazzled confection is Tom Gustafson who lets his imagination explode. He's assembled a vibrant cast of adorable young talents on the rise. And the way he brings Shakespeare to life via song is genius; from plaintive ballads to brilliantly-choreographed dance numbers, this is musical showmanship that rivals HEDWIG! The best thing, though, is that he doesn't just dabble in brief moments of magic; he lets Timothy's purple-pink fantasies and Puck's erotic spell take over the entire film. (USA, 2008, 95 mins)
